

Promotion Policy

Classes I-III

There is no formal examination for Classes I to III. The evaluations in Classes I-III is spread over two terms during one academic session:

- a. One Evaluation means that all the students of the class are tested in all the competencies.
- b. The testing is done simultaneously while teaching or after the completion of syllabus.

Classes IV - X

1. In order to be declared as 'Passed', a candidate shall obtain not less than 33% marks in each of the five subjects separately and in aggregate.
2. Students has to secure 33% marks out of overall 20 marks earmarked in each subject in Internal Assessment, Notebook and Subject Enrichment activity too.
3. If a student gets less than 33% in one subject, his/her promotion in the said subject will be as per the guidelines issued by DOE/CBSE/SET.
4. A student having less than 75% attendance in an academic session shall not be permitted to appear in the Final Examination.
5. Any other promotion rule applicable as per the policy of Directorate of Education, Govt. of Delhi/CBSE.
6. Students will be awarded Marks as well as grades in classes VI-X.

Classes XI- XII

- In order to be declared as 'Passed' a candidate shall obtain not less than 33 % marks in each of the five subjects on Cumulative basis in theory and practical separately.
- If a student gets less than 33% in one subject, he/she will be placed in 'compartment' in the said subject as per the rules. Student failing in more than one subject shall not be promoted.
- In case of absence due to medical reason, the student may be exempted from First Term Examination in the respective subject and may be promoted on the basis of the annual examination only. However if a student fails to appear for final examination due to medical grounds, he/she shall give his/her exam along with compartment examination. Medical certificate is necessary.
- In case of a subject involving practical work a student must obtain 33% marks in theory and 33% marks in practical separately in addition to 33% marks in aggregate in order to qualify in that subject.
- Compartment exam is conducted from the entire syllabus.

Important Guidelines

- As per the CBSE Examination Bye laws, updated 2013 # Rule 13.1*****
 - No student from a School affiliated to the Board shall be eligible to take the examination unless he has completed 75% of attendance counted from the opening of Class up to the 1st of the month preceding the month in which the examination commences in the subjects of internal assessment.

2. Any unfair means reported during Examination-
 - a) A warning letter will be issued to the student using unfair means during examination. Repetition of the same will result in suspension.
 - b) In case of cheating, Zero to be awarded in that answer sheet and assessment will be done on the basis of second sheet provided to him/her at that time. No extra time will be given.
3. If a student has joined the school in mid-session, he/she will be assessed on the basis of his/her performance in the exam he/she appeared for.
4. No student should be absent during Periodic Test / Term End Examination; in case of medical leave, a copy of medical certificate is compulsory.
