

Promotion Policy

Classes Nursery-II

There is no formal examination for classes Nursery to II. The teachers evaluate students through continuous and comprehensive evaluation system. The evaluations in Classes Nur-II is spread over two terms during one academic session.

1. One evaluation means that all students of the class are tested in all the competencies.
2. The testing is done simultaneously while teaching or after the completion of syllabus.

Classes III-V

There will be two means and four assessments

Components to be assessed:

For languages (English & Hindi)	:	Listening + Speaking + reading +
For Mathematics	:	Notebooks + Mental Math + MCQ + Activity/Project + Notebooks
For environment Science/General Science	:	Environmental Sensitivity + Project /
For Social Science	:	Activity + Scientific Skills + Notebooks + Social Sensitivity (Survey & diagrams) + Map Work + Activity /Project + Notebooks

CO-SCHOLASTIC AREAS

The following Co-scholastic areas are to be assessed:

1. Work Education/ ICT
2. Art Education (Art and Craft)
3. Health and Physical Education
4. Visual and Performing Arts (Music and Dance)
5. Discipline (Attendance, Sincerity, Behaviour, and Values)

Classes VI-XII

Note: Classes VI-XI and XI* (As per ther CBSE Guidelines which is intimated as and when Updated by CBSE)

1. It is mandatory to appear in all Examinations.
2. A students has to obtain not less than 33% marks (in both: theory & internal assessment) in each of the five subjects separately and in aggregate in order to be declared as 'Passed.'
3. If a sudent gets less than 33% in one subject, his/her promotion in the said subject will be as per the guidelines issued by CBSE.
4. Students will be awarded Marks as well as grades. In order to be declared as "passed", a candidate shall obtain not less than 33% marks in each of the five subjects on comulative basis in theory and practical separately in Class XI.

5. If a student gets less than 33% in any subjects, he/she will be placed in 'compartment' in the said subject as per the rules.

Important Guidelines:

- 75% attendance is mandatory to appear in the final examination. In case a student joins late due to late admission/medical grounds, attendance shall be calculated from the date of joining and he/she will be assessed on the basis of performance in the exam he/she appeared for.
- A warning letter will be issued to the student using unfair means in the examination. Repetition of the same will result in suspension. In case of cheating, zero to be awarded in the answer sheet and assessment will be done on the basis of second sheet provided to him/her at that time. No extra time will be given.
